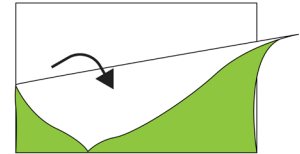
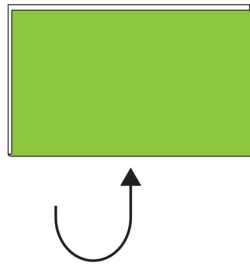
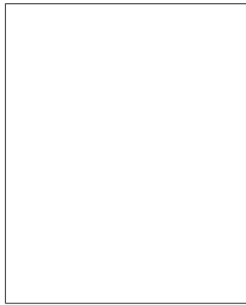




Make a kite!

This super-simple kite can fly high on a windy day! You'll need a rectangular sheet of scrap paper, tape or a stapler, thin, strong string, and a hole punch (optional).

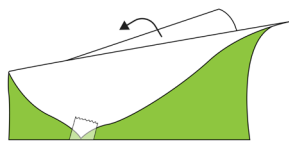


1. Start with a square piece of scrap paper. 8.5" x 11" paper works fine, but you can experiment with other sizes.

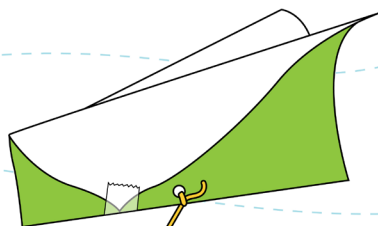
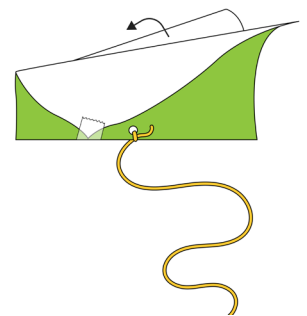
2. Fold the paper in half, bringing the short edges together. Crease firmly.

3. Bend one corner down to meet the folded edge, as shown. Do not fold the paper, allow it to curl over.

4. Bend the opposite corner down in the same way. Secure both corners in place with a single piece of tape or a staple. The kite now has two curved wings



5. Ask an adult to help you punch a hole halfway along the lower edge of the kite. Securely tie a piece of thin, strong string to the kite. Alternatively, you can staple the kite and tie the string to the staple.



6. Take the kite outside on a windy day, trail it behind you as you run, and enjoy!
